

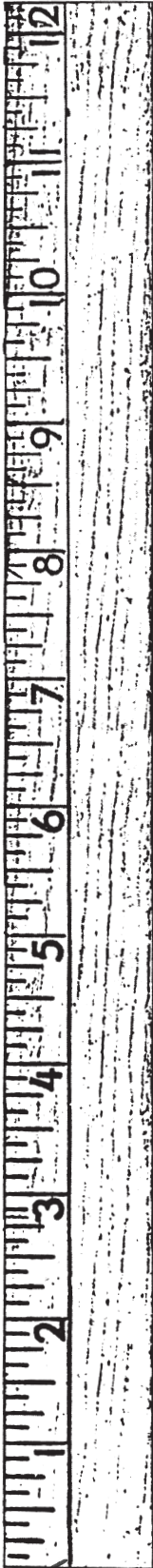
# Golden Rules
